# Baby Owl Ornaments

### What you'll need:

- ♥ Worsted-weight yarn in any color
- ▼ Embroidery thread for beak
- ♥ White felt for eyes
- ♥ F/5 3.75mm crochet hook
- ▼ Two 6mm plastic safety eyes w/ plastic washers
- ♥ Poly-Fil or any stuffing of your choice
- ▼ Yarn needle
- ♥ Embroidery needle
- ▼ Fabric glue


## Abbreviation key:

- ♥ sc single crochet♥ st/sts stitch/stitches
- ▼ dec decrease (join next 2 sts into 1)
- ▼ inc increase (2sc in next st)



- ▼ This is crocheted in a spiral, so do not join at the end of each round. Use something to mark the first stitch of a round, and move it up as you work.
- ▼ "The Magic Circle" is used to start each piece. If you do not prefer this technique, you can start each piece using the following technique: ch 2, then sc x6 into the second chain away from the hook. SI st to join the round. This creates Round 1.
- ▼ For this model, I used Lily Sugar 'n Cream's 100% cotton yarn

**Preparation:** For one owl, cut two circles out of white felt for the eyes. Each circle's diameter is about 0.8 inch (23mm). Cut a small slit halfway between the center of the circle and the outer edge of each eye. Insert safety eyes, but **DO NOT attach washers** until instructed to do so. Refer to the diagram below.



# **Owl Pattern:**

#### Using any color yarn,

Round 1: Magic Circle with a base of 6 stitches

**Round 2:** inc x6= 12 sts

**Round 3:** (1 inc, sc in next st) x6 = 18 sts

**Round 4:** (1 inc, sc in next 2 sts) x6 = 24 sts

Round 5:  $(1 \text{ inc, sc in next } 3 \text{ sts}) \times 6 = 30 \text{ sts}$ 

**Round 6:** sc in the next 30 sts = 30 sts

Round 7:  $(1 \text{ dec}, \text{ sc in next } 3 \text{ sts}) \times 6 = 24 \text{ sts}$ 

Round 8-10: sc in the next 24 sts = 24 sts

**Round 11:** (1 dec, sc in next 2 sts) x6 = 18 sts

**Round 12:** (1 dec, sc in next st) x6 = 12 sts Fasten off and leave an 8" tail for sewing.

#### Making the face:

1. Insert prepared eyes. Insert the left eye between Rounds7&8. Insert the other eye about two stitches to the right of the left eye. The white felt pieces should meet. Adjust as needed.


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- 2. Attach washers to secure safety eyes.
- **3.** Use fabric glue to secure the white felt in place. DO NOT glue in the tiny portion between the eyes. You will need to sew through this spot.
- 4. Embroider the beak

#### Finishing the owl:

- 1. Stuff with Poly-Fil.
- **2. Pinch the top of the owl flat and use yarn tail to sew shut.** This should create a slightly curved shape.
- 3. Attach ribbon to make it an ornament.
